Awarding & applying for Grants

The Finance Committee considered applications from 8 organisations. All were award a grant of varying size, with a total of £4k awarded across these groups. The Deputy Clerk has now submitted the PTC application and we hope to hear back from HCC in coming weeks. The Clerk has been successful with her application for further trees from the Woodland Trust with a total of 240 trees coming in March.

Engaging the Community

 Twynams field Fat ball making/ tree planting session with Wyvern Football Club on Saturday 2nd December was unfortunately cancelled due to staff sickness, but these have been rescheduled for the New Year. The fat ball making session will be held on Wednesday 14th February during school half term and the tree planting and litter picking with Wyvern Football Club is taking place on Saturday 20th January.

 The Orchard - On 7th Dec, The Clerk and Community Development Officer held a successful community consultation event at the Lapstone pub. Around 12 residents attended this informal drop in 2-hour session, where residents shared their ideas for the space. This is the first of a few idea gathering sessions which will be available for residents, the next one will be on 14th February 24.

Community development updates cont ...

- Fair Oak infants tree planting: On 8th December The Clerk, Community • Development Officer and member of the Grounds Op's team held an afternoon tree planting for Fair Oak infants school. 150 children came along to each plant a tree and place their personalised pebble next to it, along with their teachers and helpers. Species such as Rowan, Hawthorn and Dog Rose were planted as part of the mixed native hedge which now runs along the bunds by the skate park at Knowle Park.
- Bee and tree corridor The Clerk and CDO have met with Helen Brown to discuss a number of sites that could be suitable within the parish. These have been collated and Helen will be carrying out site visits in the new year to assess these. If found suitable, it's hoped that these will be planted out during autumn 24.

Corporate Updates

Cafe = the building has almost complete the internal works to the cafe and hopes to be off site before Christmas.

External works still need to be complete, the kitchen & serving counter also need to be installed.

Other outstanding works such as entrance mats, tiling of the serving area, artwork, soft landscaping, public art installation will take place during January-February.

It is hoped that the Cafe will be able to open to the public on in March.

Climate change = the Deputy Clerk has now submitted the PTC grant application for solar panels at WCC and the Clerk has applied for further trees from the Woodland Trust.

A review of the climate action plan is currently taking place and will be brought to Full Council shortly.

We hope to offer thermal imaging surveys in February too.
